

The school will be open, not only with open doors, but also with open people.









In September, the school announced the names of the seniors. We had our first meeting to select officers. We finally decided to have these officers:


President—Buddy Fisher Vice President—Chris Wehrli Secretary—Theresa Strong Treasurer—Steve Gasco




