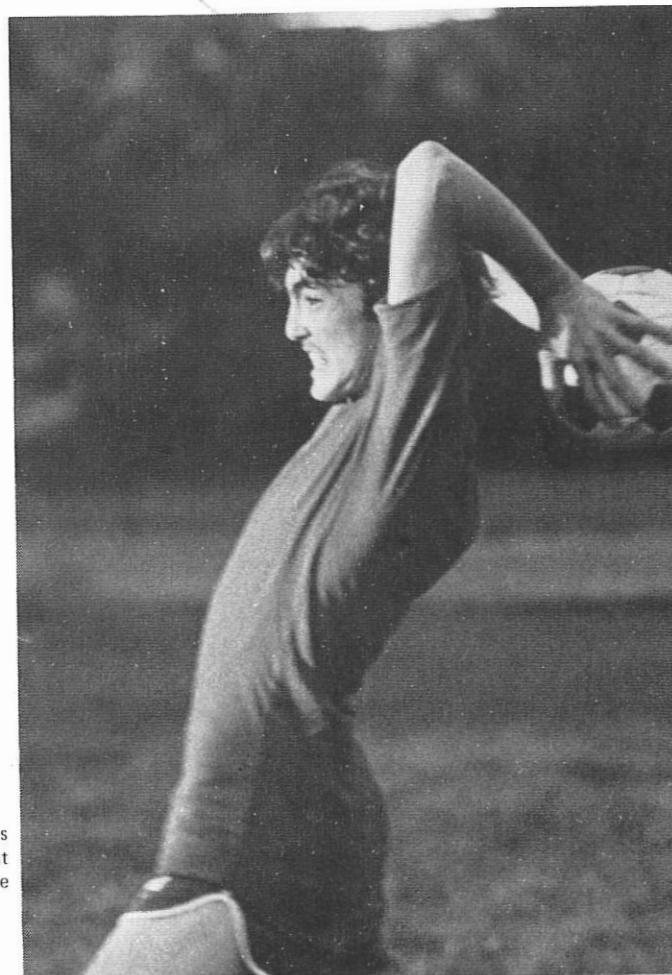
The Eagles showed improvement in their second season of soccer and finished on a winning note with a 4-3 slate. Coach Vlug is optimistic about the future.

The top scorers for MSSD were Eugene Goss and Jimmy Newsome, who knocked in six goals each.

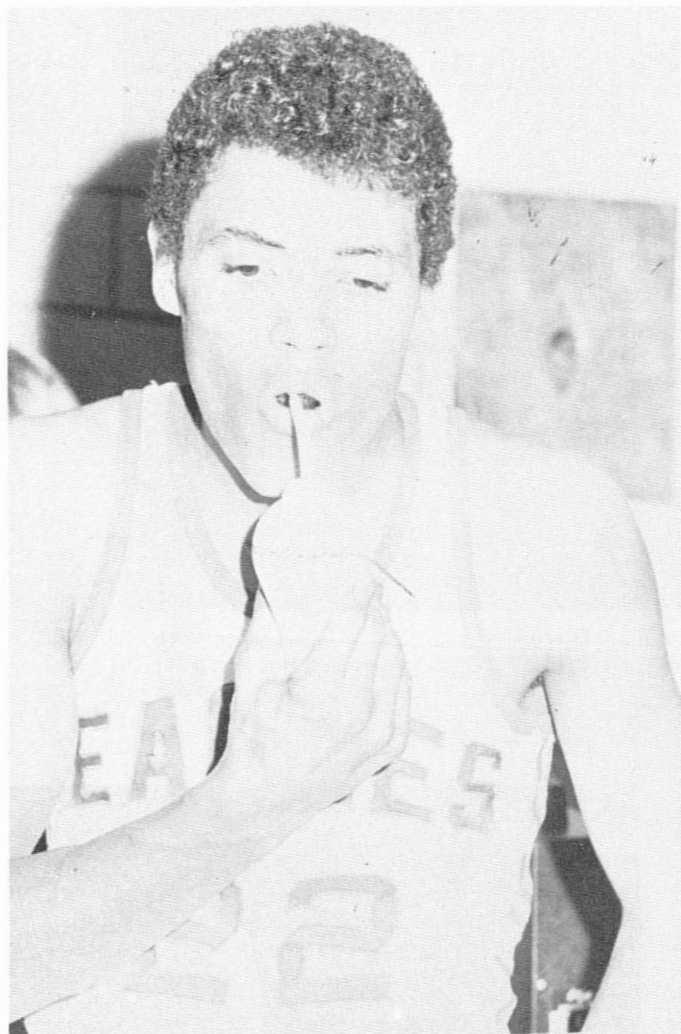

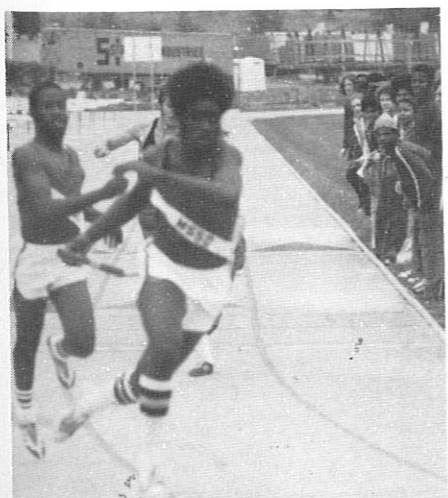
