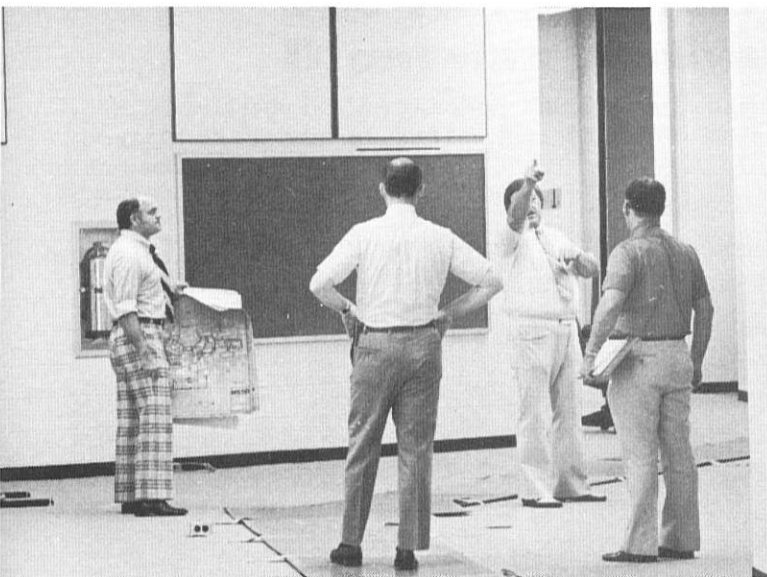

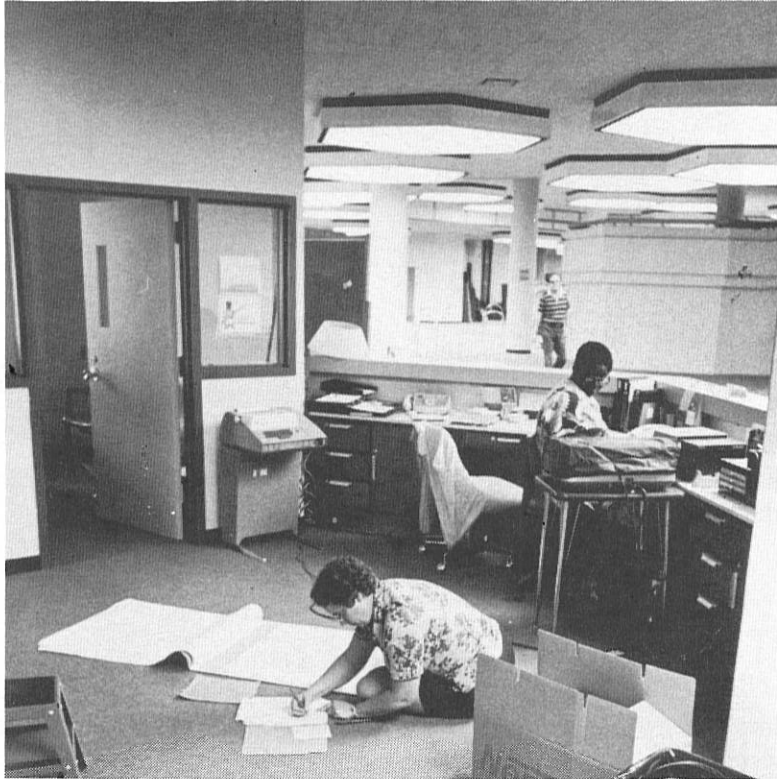


The move is on!

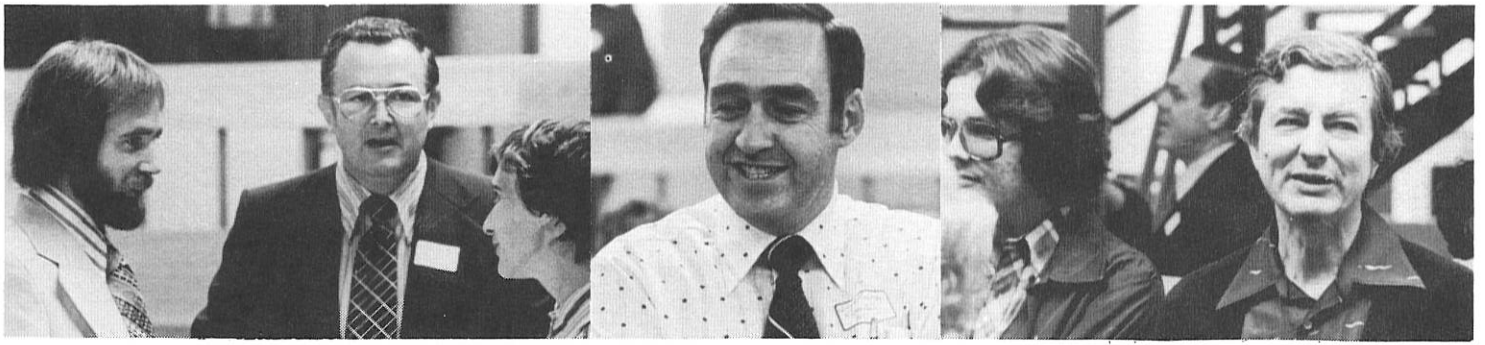


# ALMOST ANYTHING GOES!

Jeff Emmons was the team photographer. He made up a show of 35 mm slides about the project.



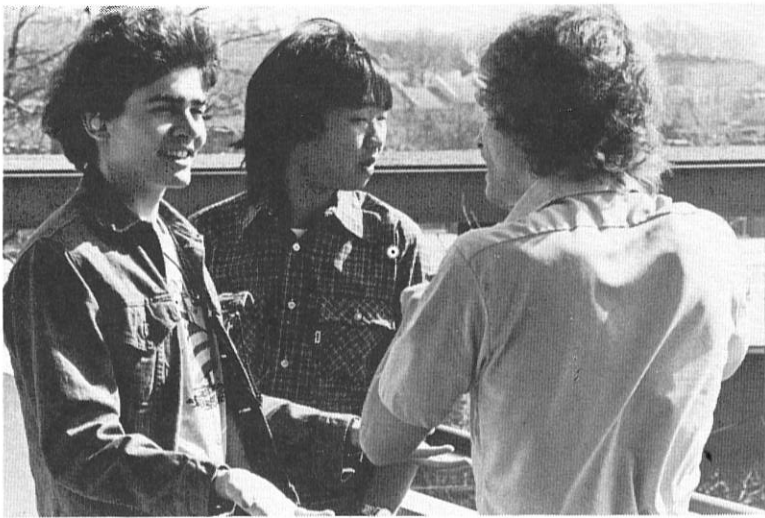


## Project

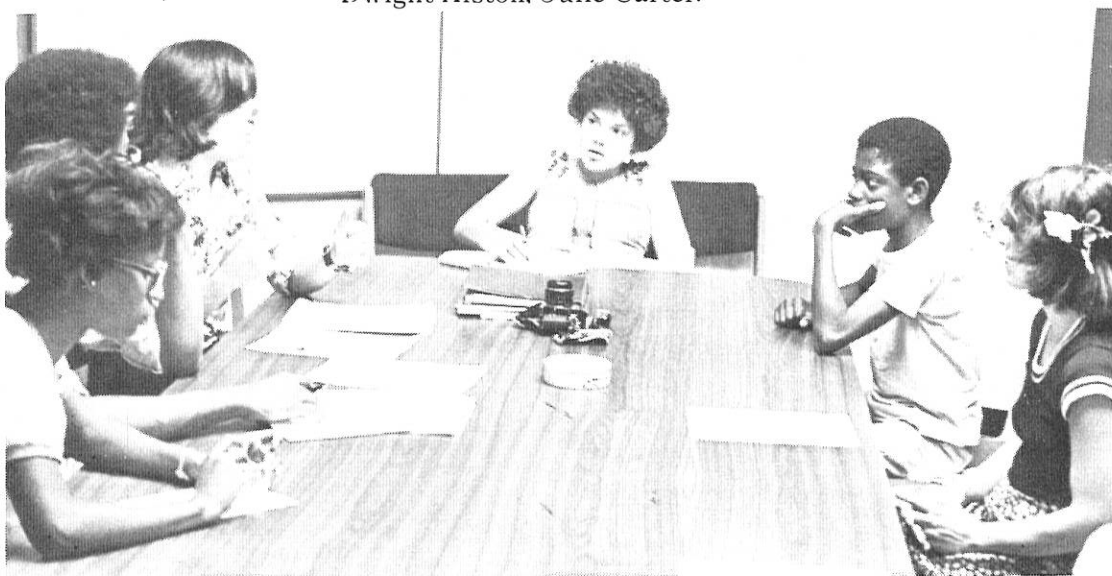

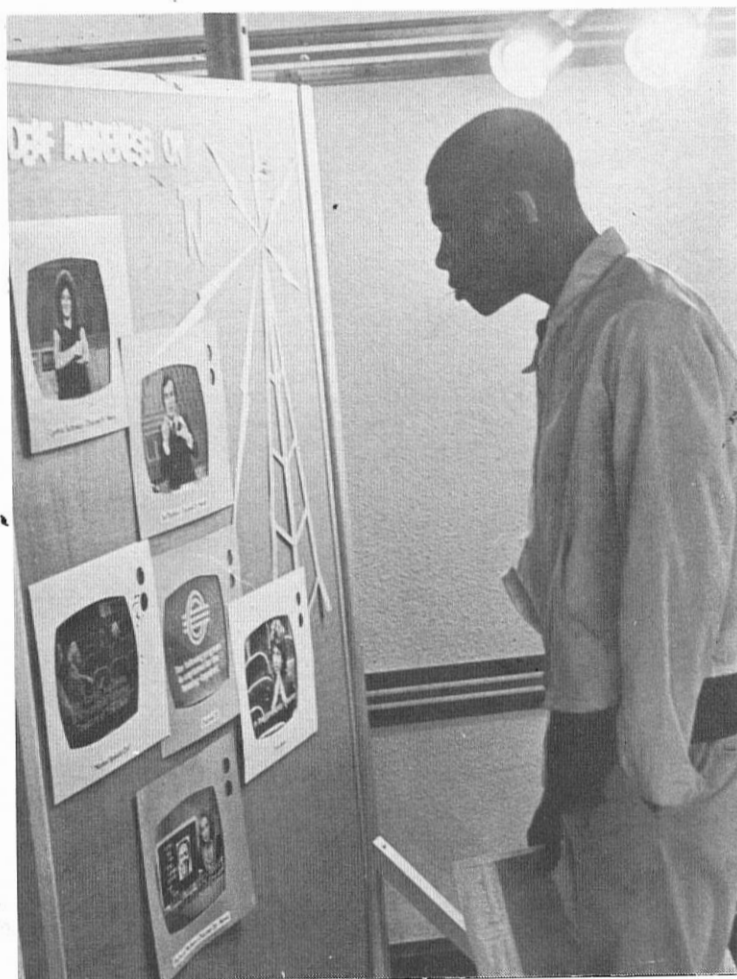
The students learned how other people feel about their own deafness. They saw exhibits of magazines and books, and bulletin boards about deafness and deaf people.

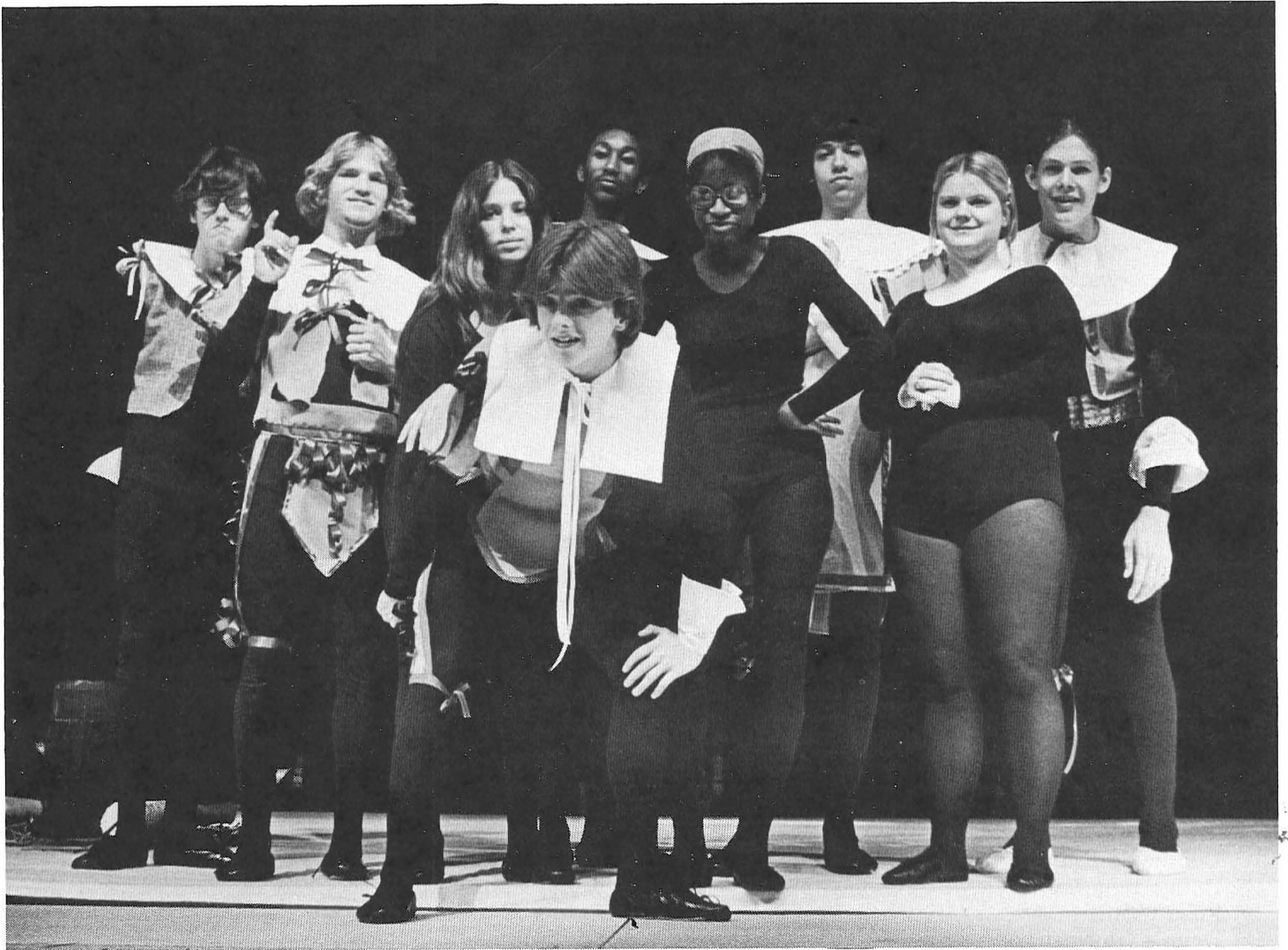
# The Doctor In Spite Of Himself

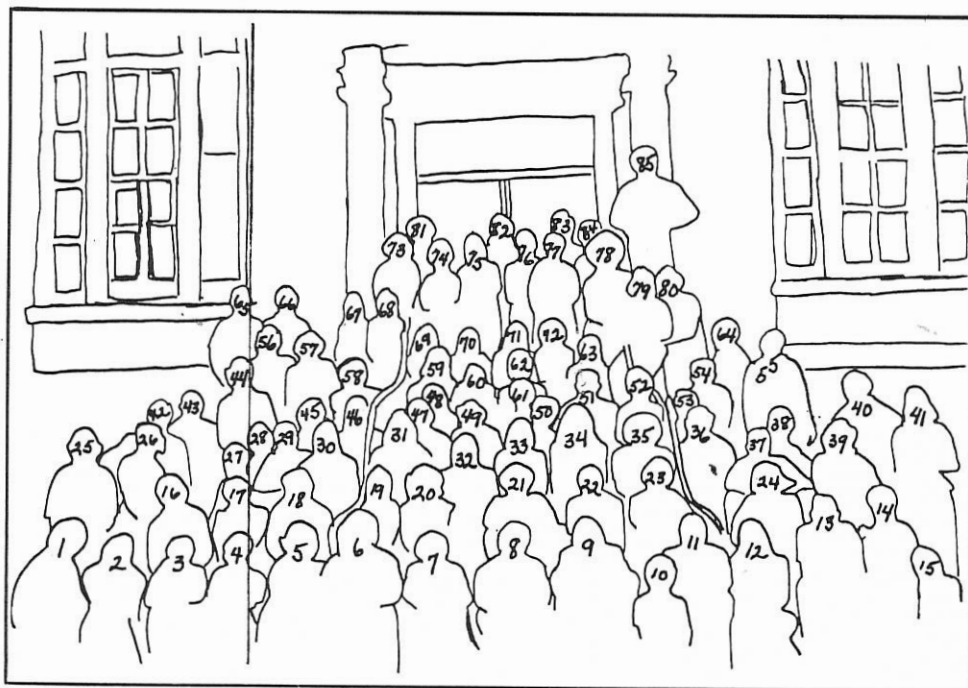

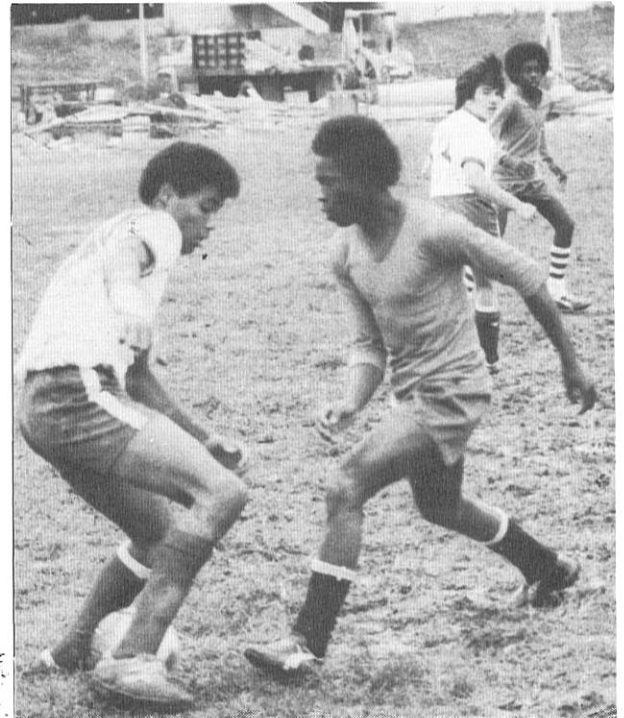

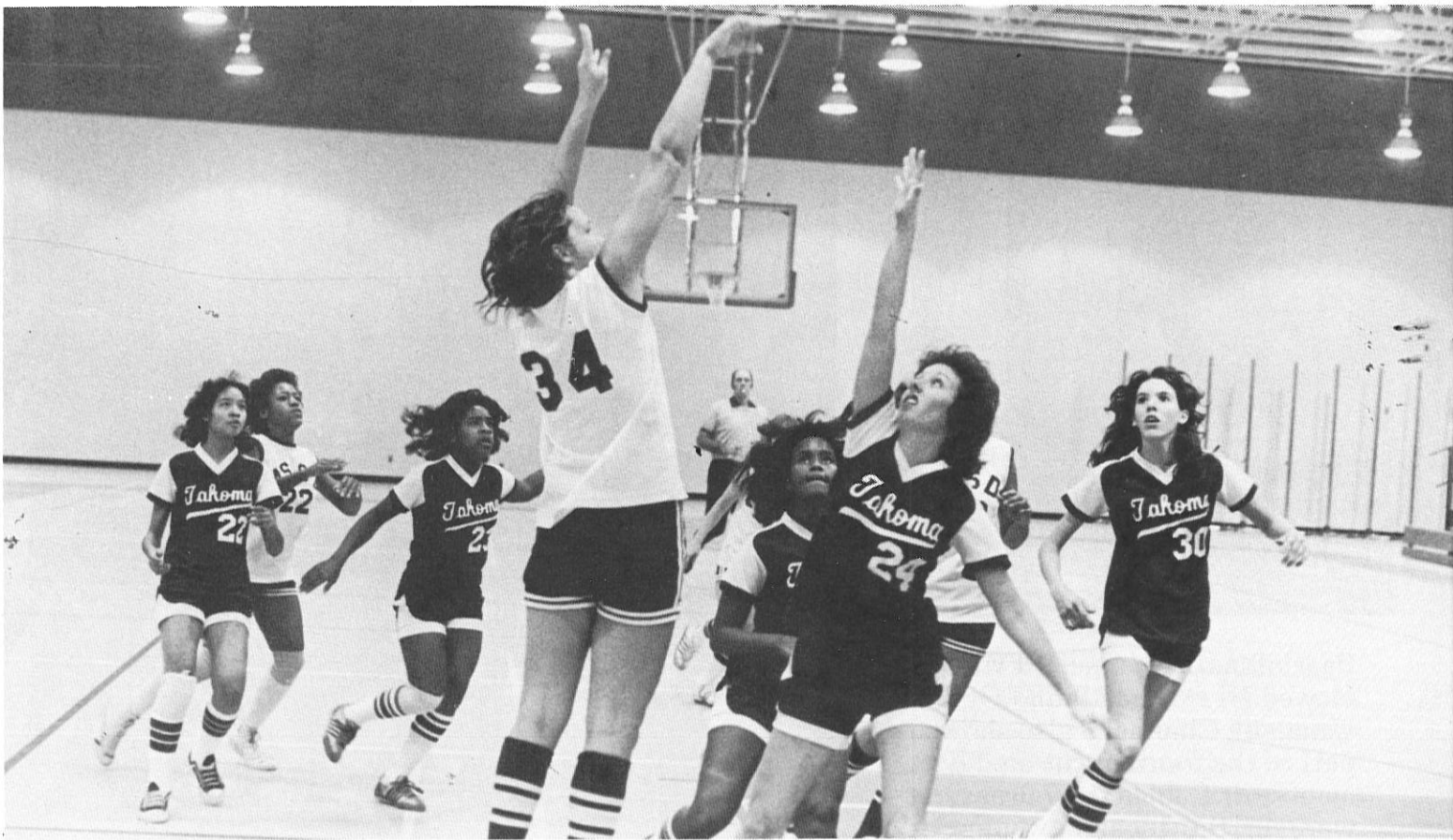

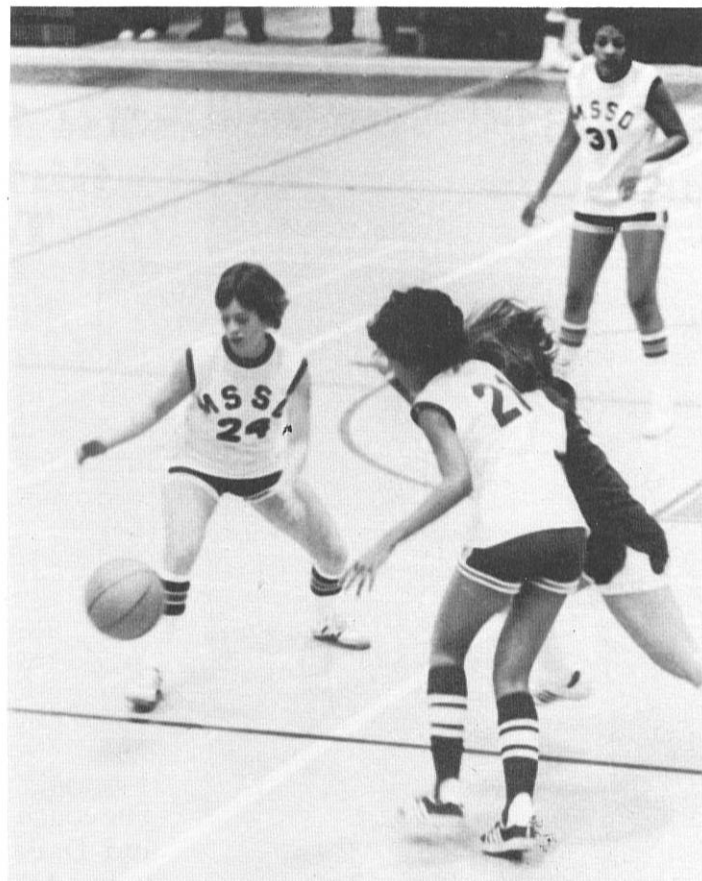
## Girls' Basketball
