Head Coach Bob Westermann was very proud of this team, because this is the team that established a winning tradition at MSSD.






Scoreboard









DENISE BEST WASHINGTON, D.C. TAURUS








JEANETTE BYRD WASHINGTON, D.C. AQUARIUS




BONNY DALY CHESAPEAKE, VA CAPRICORN








ANDRE DILL WASHINGTON, D.C. AQUARIUS

Gayle attended Kendall Demonstration Elementary School before coming to MSSD in 1974. Her future plans are undecided.









BRENDA FOOTE VIRGINIA BEACH, VA. VIRGO








KAREN GEE WASHINGTON, D.C. SAGITTARIUS




GLENN GEORGE RIVERDALE, MD TAURUS








SUSAN HINCKLEY ROCKVILLE, MD CAPRICORN




DANIEL HINES GALESVILLE, MD AQUARIUS

RAYMOND JOHNSON BRANDYWINE, MD LEO



Sharon came to MSSD in 1974 from Kendall Demonstration Elementary School. She played on the Girls Basketball team and plans to work after she graduates.






ORTRUN NIETHAMMER WUPPERTAL, WEST GERMANY TAURUS
