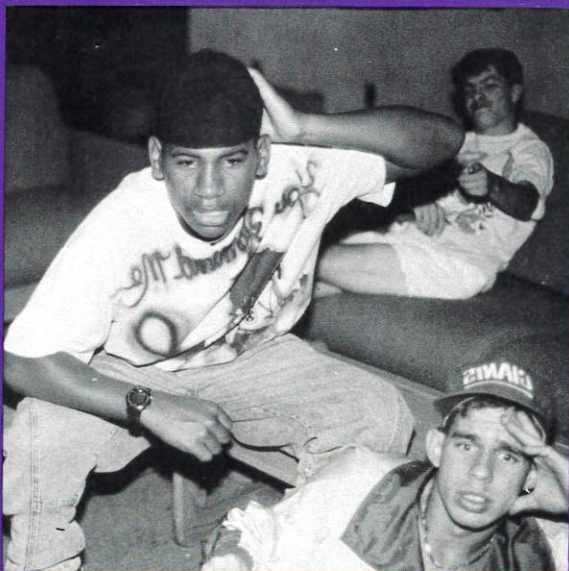

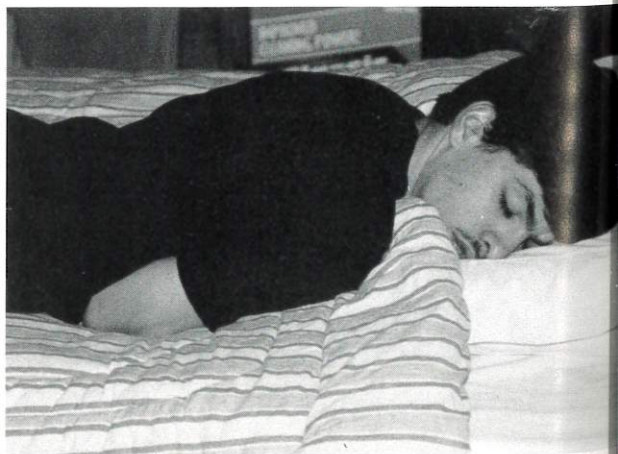

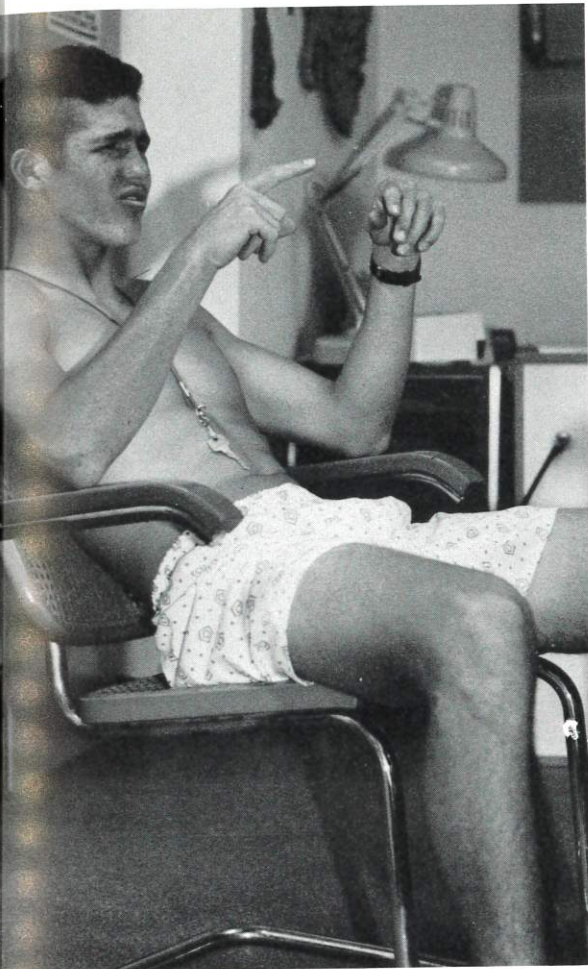

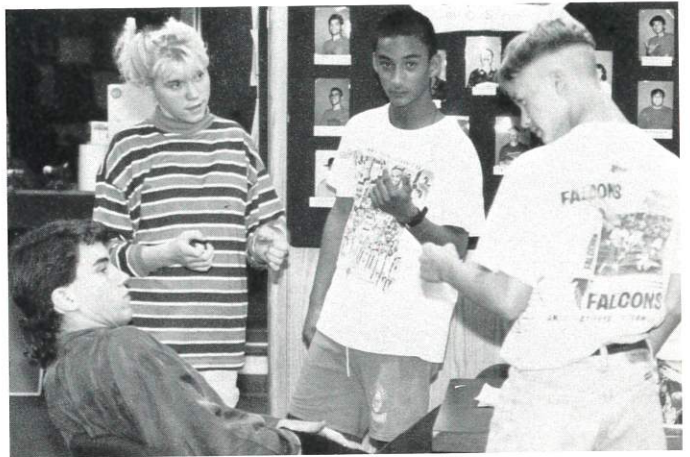

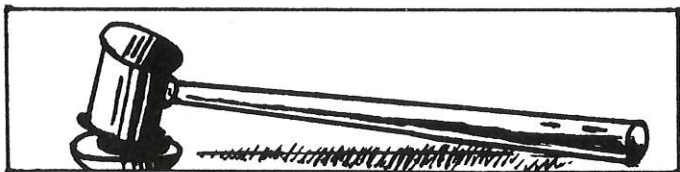
Judicial Enrichment Day

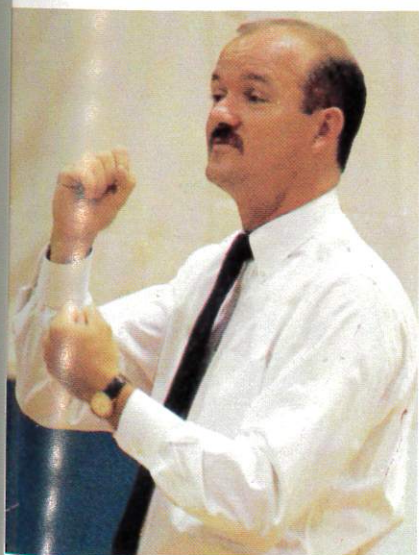

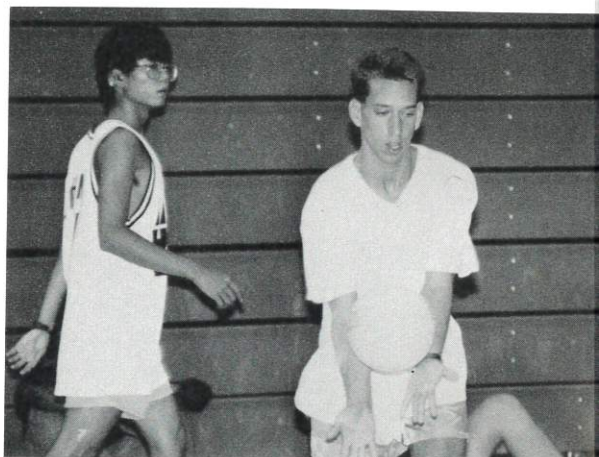

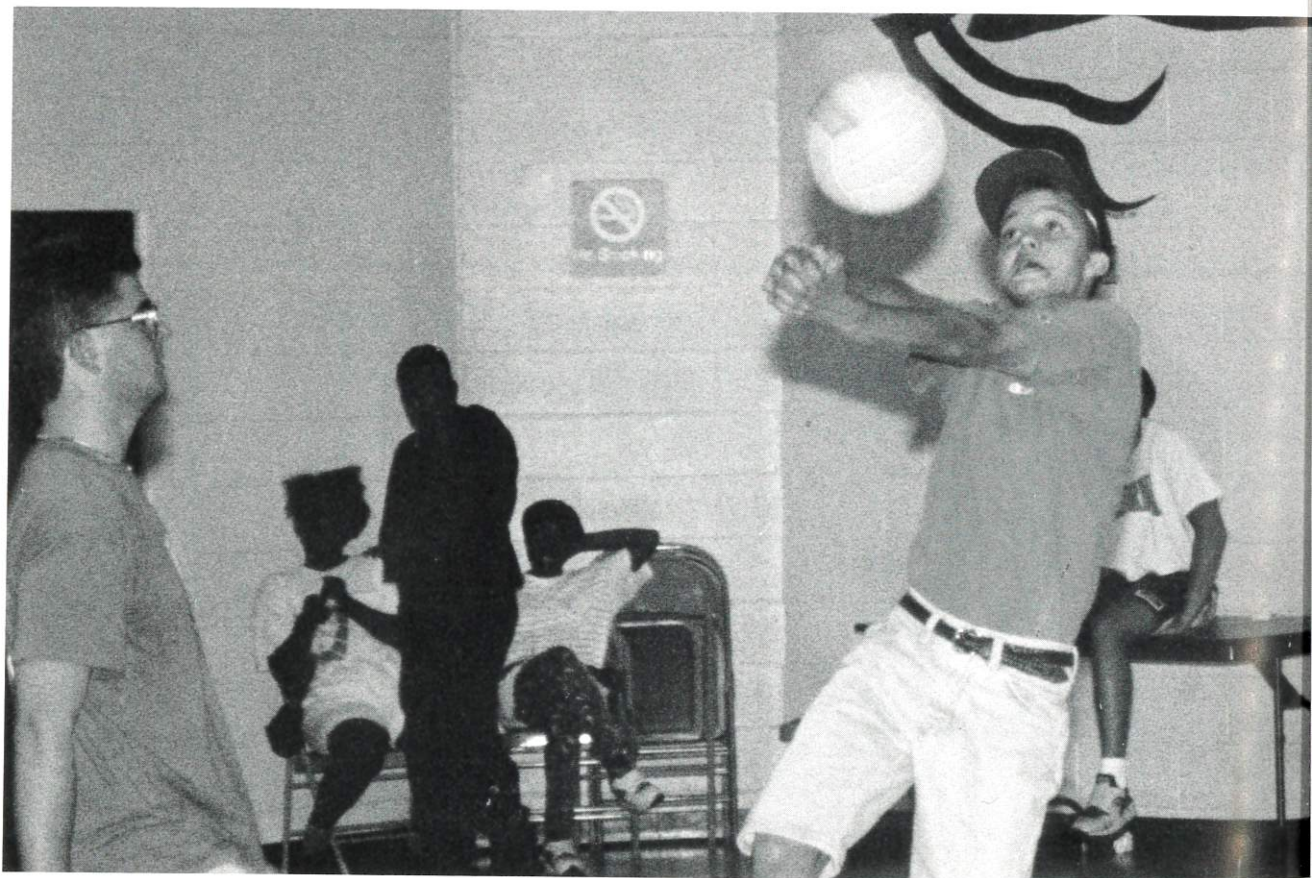
Old and New Faces

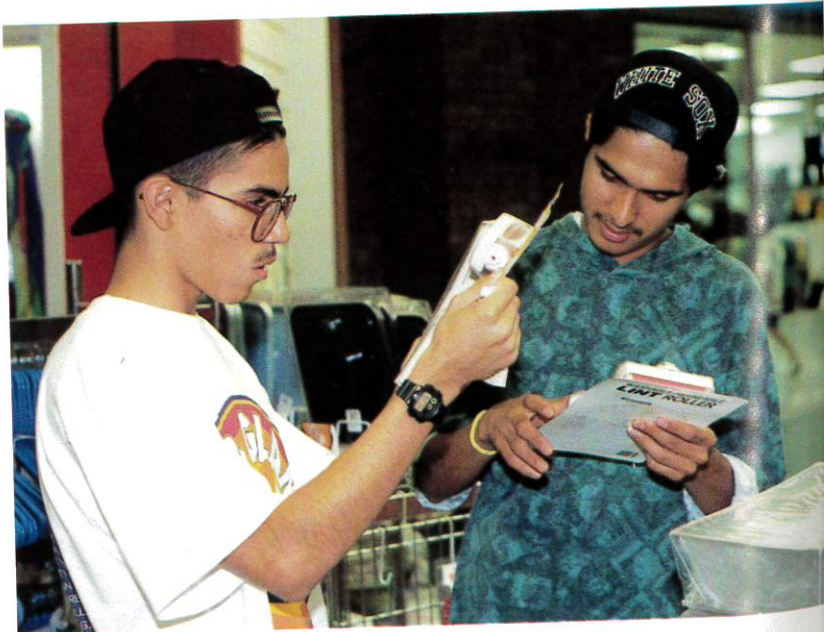

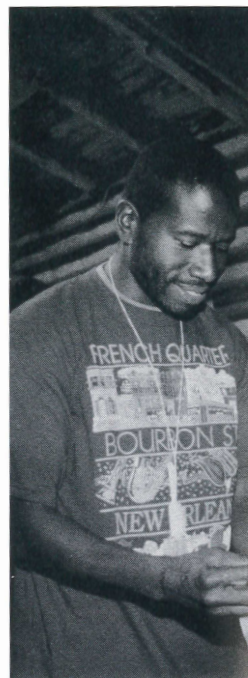
There was a woman who explained what happened to her. She gave her presentation

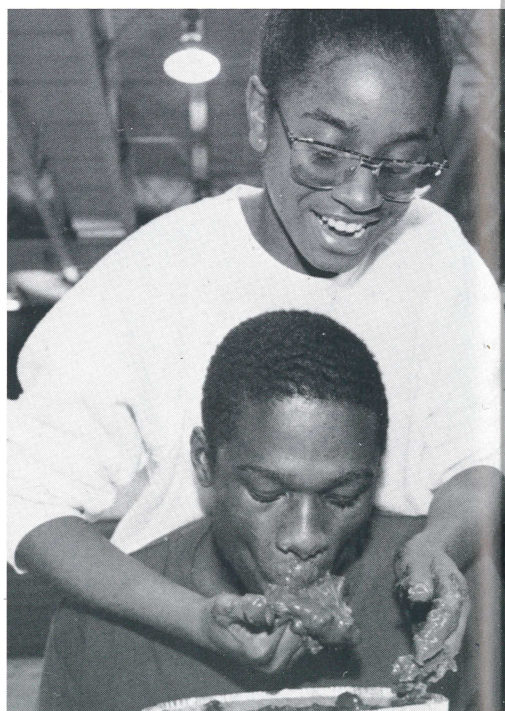

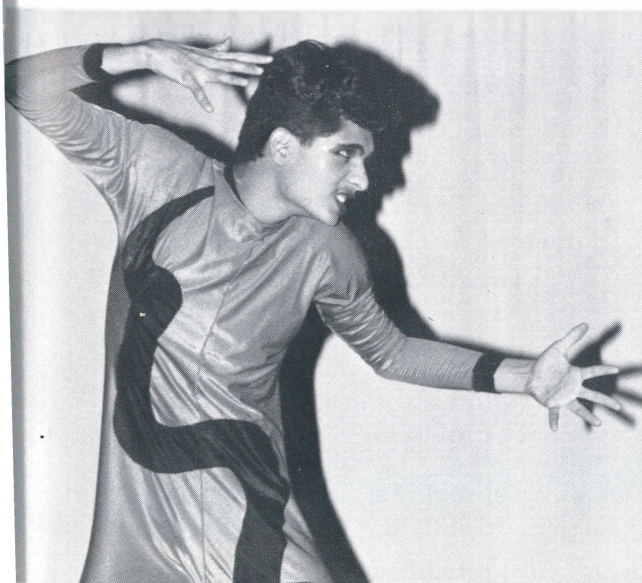

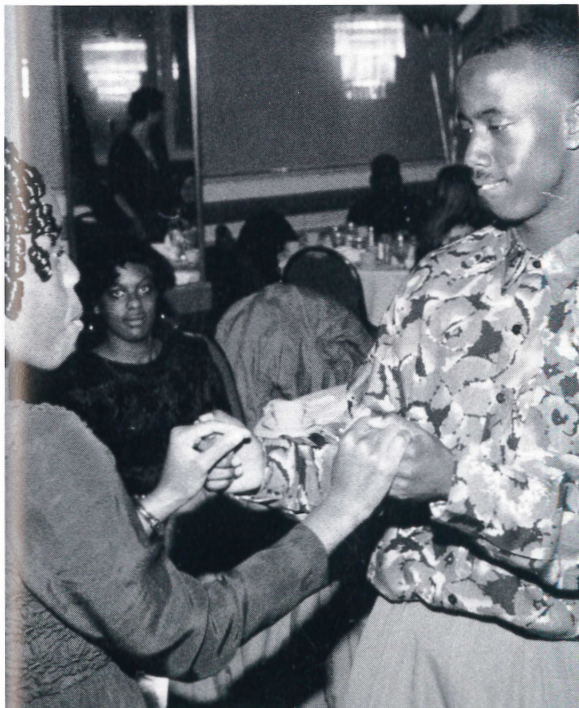
DANCE-FUL

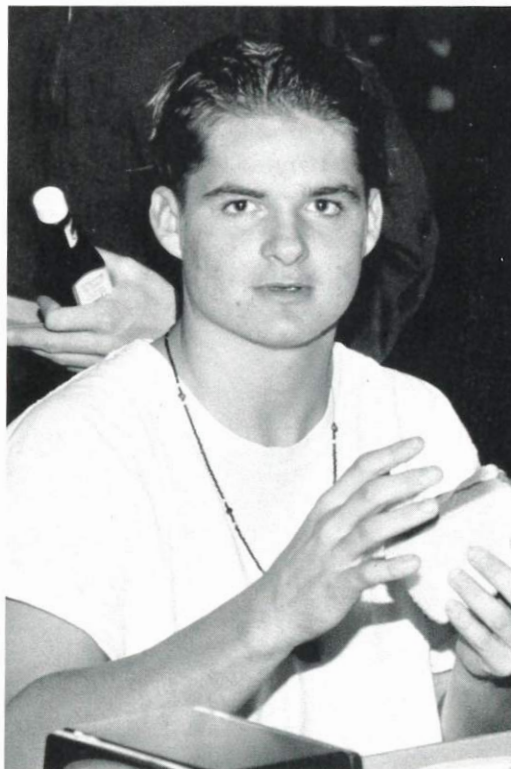

The Mess Hall

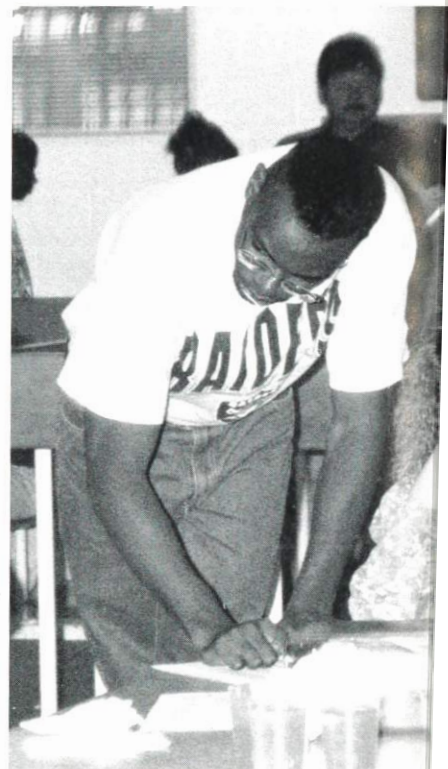

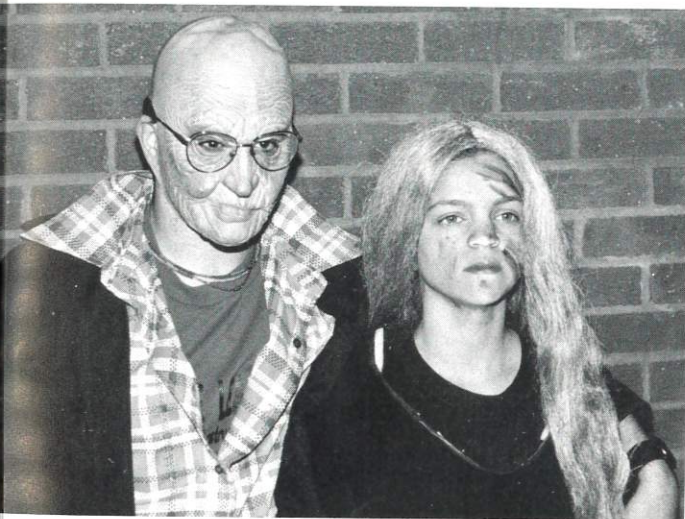

Evil Claus's Haunted House

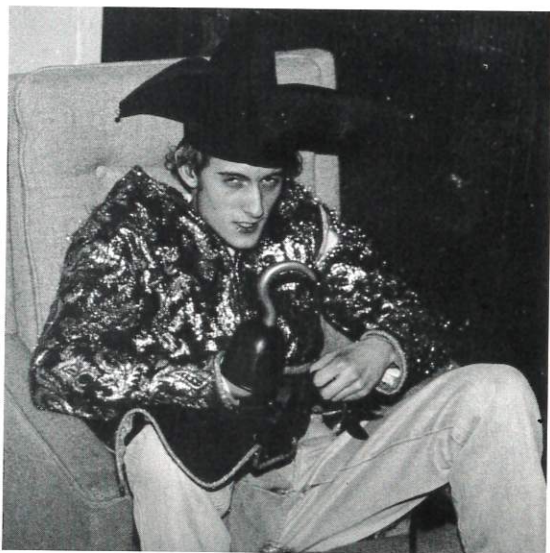

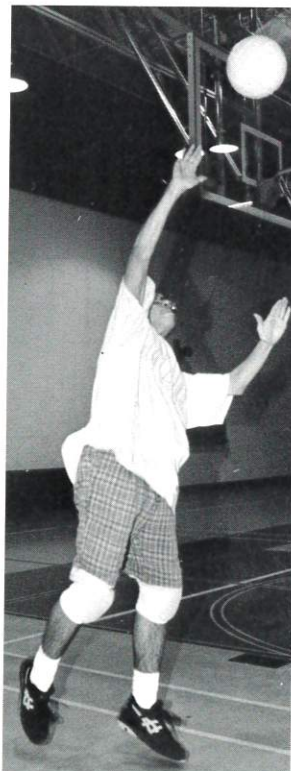

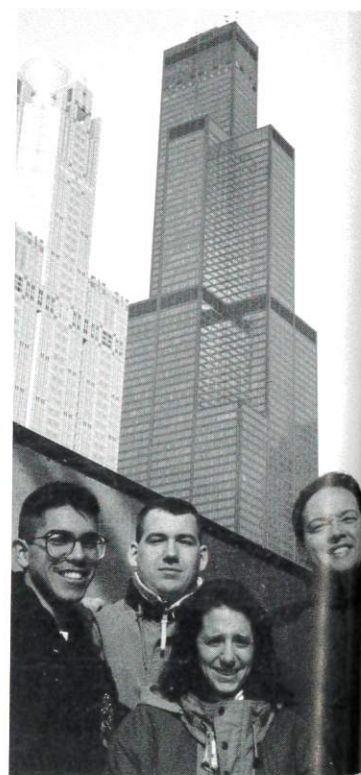

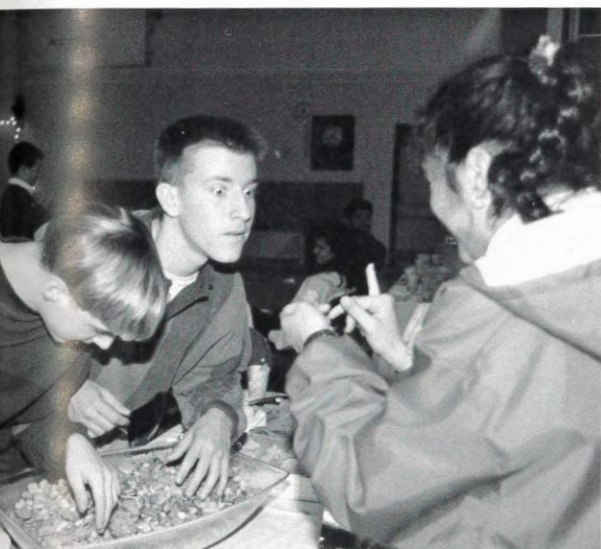

Exchange Students



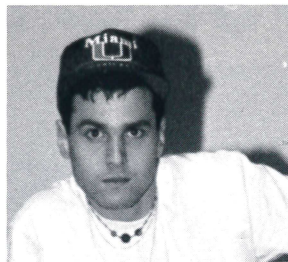
Janelle Jung is an AFS student from Australia. She arrived here last summer and will stay for a year with her host family of five, in University Park, MD. Her host father is deaf.

Janelle is the first hearing student to attend our school. She always wanted to become an exchange student. She called AFS to say that she was interested. AFS contacted her and said she was going to the U.S. She was really happy because she always wanted to see the U.S. Three weeks before Janelle was to leave, AFS called her to ask if she would be willing to attend a Deaf school. She was

surprised, but said it was fine with her because it would be an interesting experience. Before Janelle came to the U.S., she didn't know a lot about Deaf people, didn't give a lot of thought to it; and she only met one deaf person who is an oralist.

Separation from her family in Australia made her feel more independent and forced her to make her own decisions more often, but sometimes it made her feel homesick.

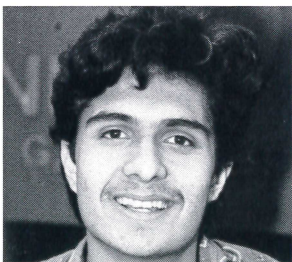
Janelle said that sign language is beautiful and she fell in love with Deaf people. She thinks that Deaf people, the Deaf world and Deaf culture are special and hopes other hearing people can have the opportunity to see how Deaf people live.



George Davidson is AFS student in Australia. He chose to visit Australia because he knew he would not be able to afford to go there in the future due to the expense. He knows that Australia has a good system of teaching English in the world. George joined AFS to gain experience of another country's culture. For example, Deaf Culture and how hearing people treat deaf people there. This experience will help him to decide his goals for the future. George was looking forward to arriving in Australia, but when the time got closer, he started to realize that he would miss his family, friends, and school in the U.S. When he arrives Australia, he will meet his host family of five; hearing parents; deaf sister, 17; hearing brother, 15; hearing sister, 9. They live north of Sydney which is one and half hours away. George thinks his experience in Australia will change him for the better.



Chris Edlund is a STS (Student Trip School) student from Sweden. He arrived here last summer to stay with his host family of four; hearing parents; hearing brother, 15; and deaf brother, 5. Chris had been dreaming about coming to the U.S. for a year since he was 10 years old. He was curious about multi-cultural issues in the U.S. Since Chris had arrived here he feels that he has changed. He's become more talkative and aware of leadership and Deaf Culture. The culture in Sweden is different from here, including shopping, Deaf Culture, and the general community. In Sweden, people always introduce themselves to each other the first time they meet, while here in America, people usually introduce themselves to each other much later.



Ivan Maldonado has been accepted into AFS and will spend a year in New Zealand with a deaf family. He

will live on the south island of New Zealand in a town called Kaiapoi, which is located near the town of Christchurch. He will be attending the Van Asch College School for the Deaf, which is a high school for deaf adolescents. He left the United States on January 19, 1993 and will be spending his time learning about hearing and Deaf cultures and New Zealand sign language.

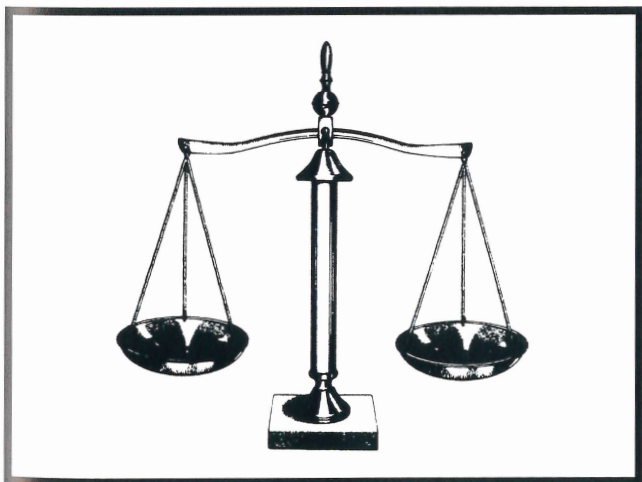

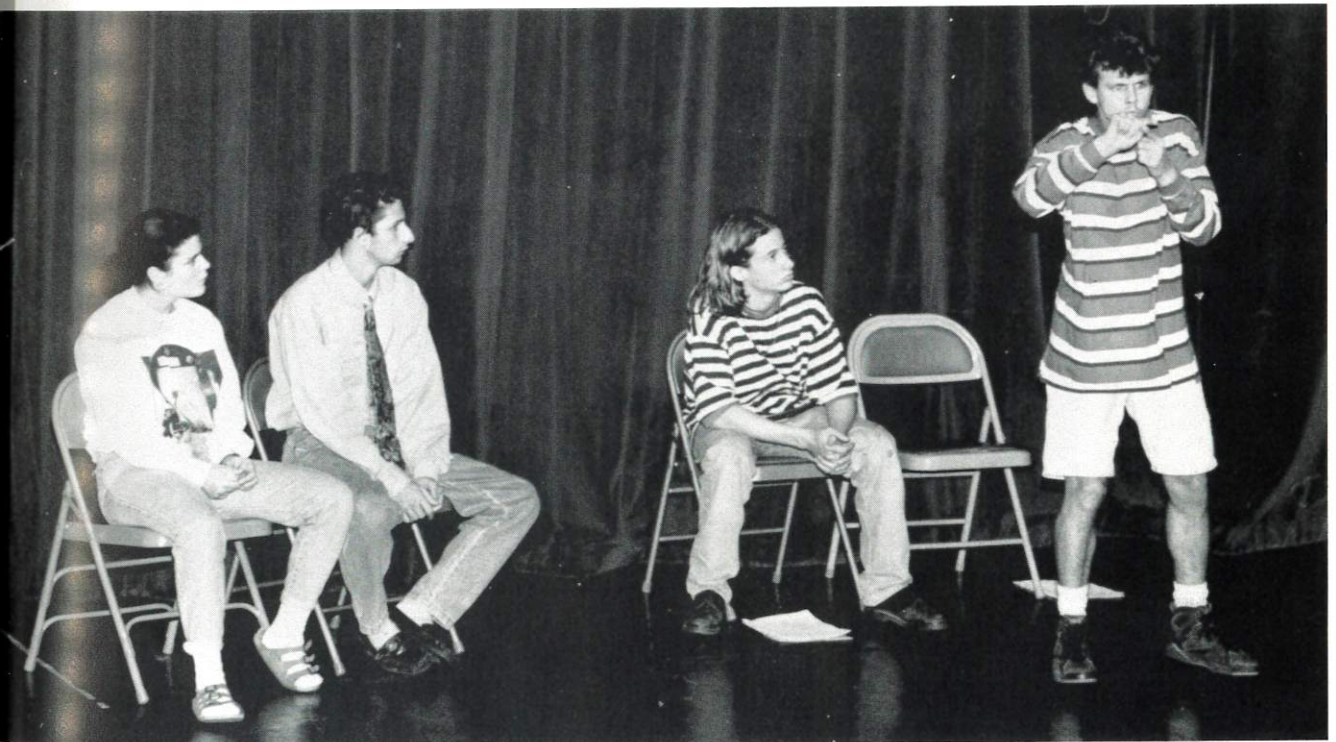

Ivan: I received the Most Valuable Player award and Honor Coach award last year.

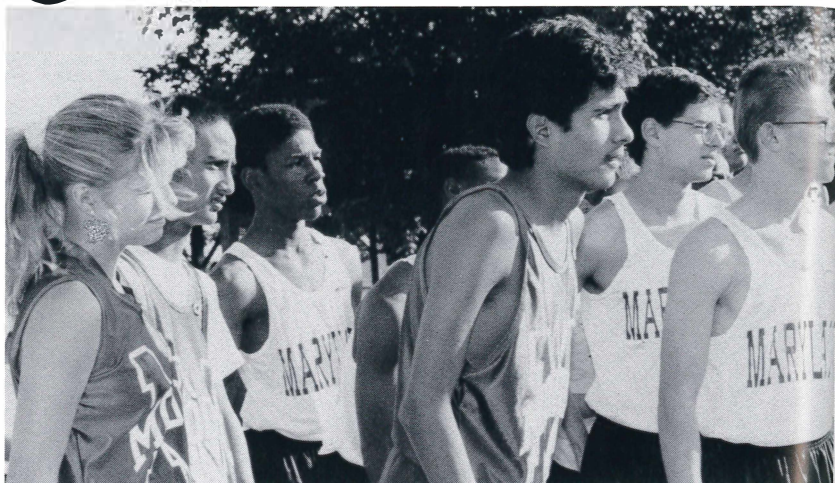

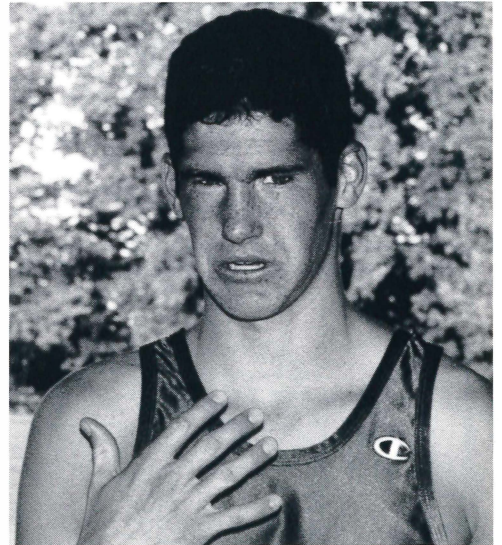

Deaf team turns it around

Model Secondary School for the Deaf in Washington, D.C., isn't unlike any other successful high school football programs.

The school turned a 2-8 record in 1991 into a 9-1 season in 1992. The Eagles won their third Tri-State Athletic Conference championship in six seasons and this month were named national deaf high school champions by the National Fraternal Society of the Deaf. Thirty schools compete for the title, which Model has won seven times in the last 14 years.

Model, with an enrollment of 120 boys, rarely competes against deaf opponents. "We average about one a year. Some years we play two and some years we don't play any," said coach Andy Bonheyo. He and his six-member coaching staff are deaf.

"I don't look at our team as unique," Bonheyo said. "We feel just like any other team. We go on the field and play football."

Said Bob Anderson, president of the National Fraternal Society of the Deaf: "They're an outstanding team and they usually have a lot of players to choose from."

Junior Ayuk Ogork, the team's leading rusher (1,096 yards) and tackler (131), said deaf players have something to prove when they face a hearing opponent.

"We think we can beat them, but they think they can't lose to us," he said. "But being deaf doesn't mean anything."
