

Adopting Brothers & Sisters











It was a memorable night. The dance was











The class is team taught by Deaf and hearing teachers, who are very experienced with deafness and Deaf Culture. This course provides students with the confidence necessary to become an effective leader.

This class involves many activities, which include community service projects like Project Harvest and Project Santa and a school-wide class project developed by the class. Most of the students enjoyed the projects because they were exposed to many leadership skills.

Almost every week there is a guest speaker in the class. They share their philosophy of leadership, talk about how they became leaders, and they discuss their different experiences as a leader.


Gonzaga to the Top

Gonzaga College High School is an all boys Catholic preparatory school located near K and North Capitol Streets, N.W. Eleven students from MSSD are currently mainstreamed at Gonzaga, or "Gonzy" as we call it. The reason for this is because these students had desires for more challenging experiences. (Plus, some girls wanted to meet boys.) Most of the students take English class, but they do have fascinating elective courses as well, such as Psychology I and Political Science. The students have to take a little gold Gallaudet University bus to get to Gonzaga. There are interpreters from Gallaudet Interpreting Service who assist us in our learning. In most classes, prayers are recited at the beginning of the class. Gonzaga enforces a strict dress code — no jeans, T-shirts, or sneakers are allowed.










Student Body Government


AFS:

Home Away From Home



I went to New Zealand for a year. My life was very different. I had a rich experience. One year equals the experiences I have had in my life in America. I lived with a hearing family. I remember when I arrived in New Zealand. It was a shock, because I lived with a hearing family who owned farmland. They had 4 cats and one horse. I'll never forget when I went to school. It was a deaf school in Van Asch College. It only had 16 students in the high school department. When I enrolled in the school, I felt like it was an elementary school. Most of the teachers were pretty good, and I loved my principal. They were oralists. I hardly could understand what they said. I finally got myself used to signing New Zealand sign language after 3 months. When I arrived back in America, I felt funny. My first reaction was thinking, "CRIME!". In New Zealand, there was less crime. Also, I was not used to big cars, big houses, and many things were bigger than they were in New Zealand. However, it was great to be back to see my family and friends again. I recommend that you go to New Zealand and have an excellent experience. And I would like to give a comment about my host family, which is that I will never forget them because I love them so much, as if they were my natural family. Thanks to AFS for giving me a unique opportunity to go to New Zealand.

I went to Australia for one year. I recall when I arrived in Sydney. That moment, when I got out of the airplane, I felt a little nervous. I looked for my host family. When I met them, I discovered that we had problems with communicating. I felt frustrated, and a little helpless. My first host-family was deaf, and I had two deaf sisters and one hearing brother. I stayed with them for two months because my old school didn't provide an interpreter. I moved

to another school in Melbourne (12 hours south of Sydney), and lived with another host-mother. She was a teacher at a deaf school. I went to community college for 3 months. I wanted more of a challenge and went back to Sydney. I moved in with another host-family. I lived with them for 6 months. My school wasn't as great as MSSD. I wasn't satisfied with the education I received. All of my classmates were strong oralists. I had the same classmates for the whole day. 
Yearbook Makers


