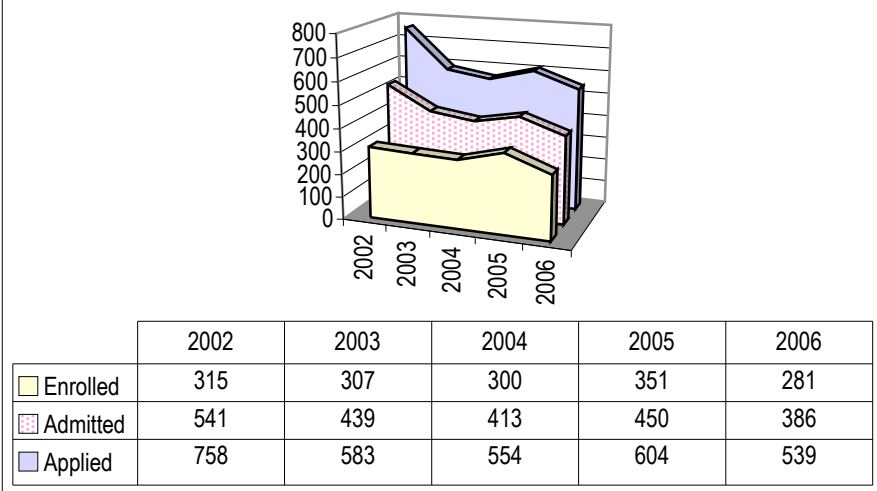

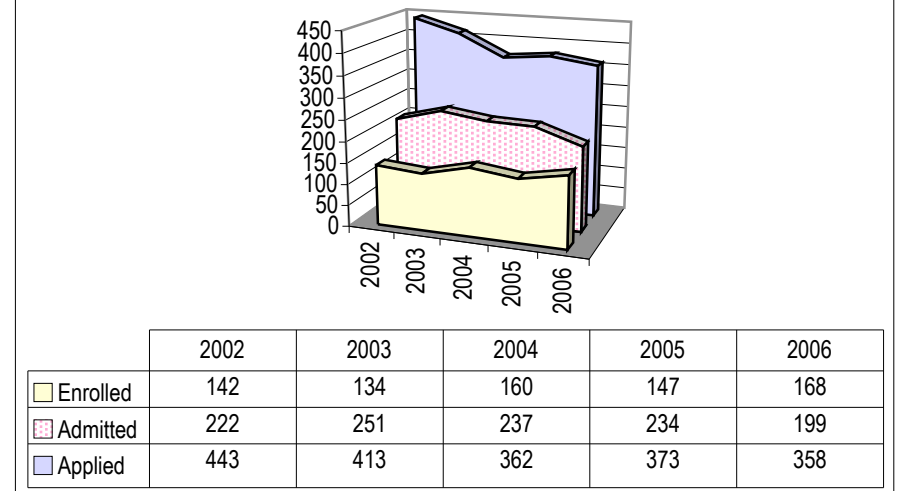

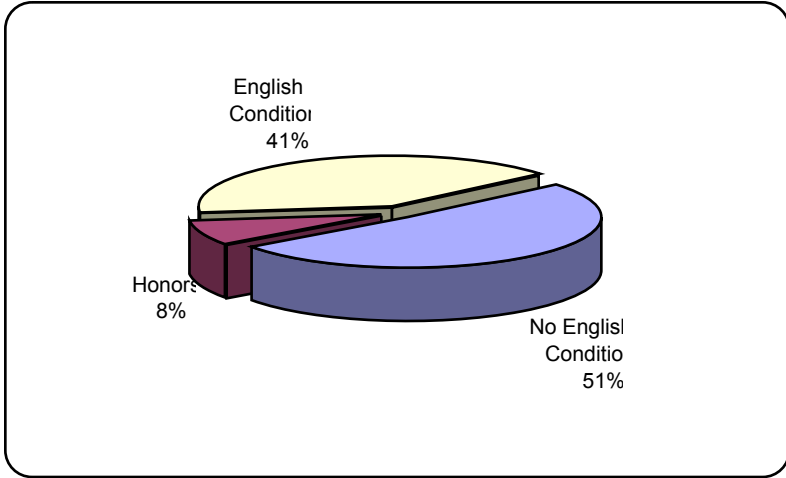

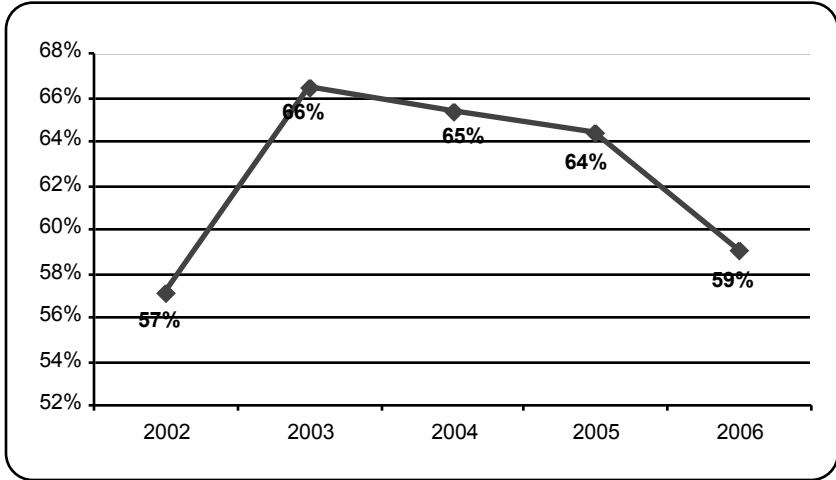

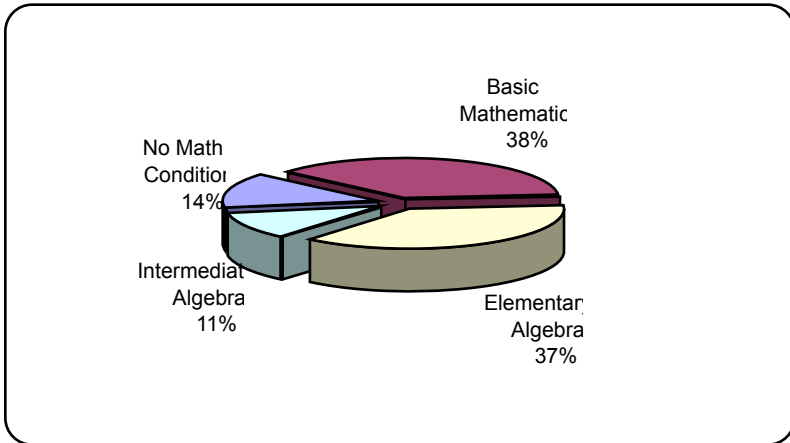
**English Placement Results**



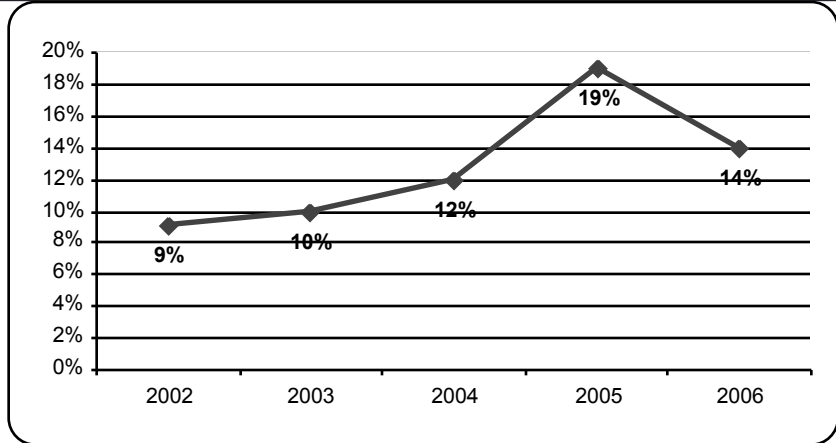
**Percentage of New Undergraduates who Tested into Freshman English or Higher, 2002 to 2006**

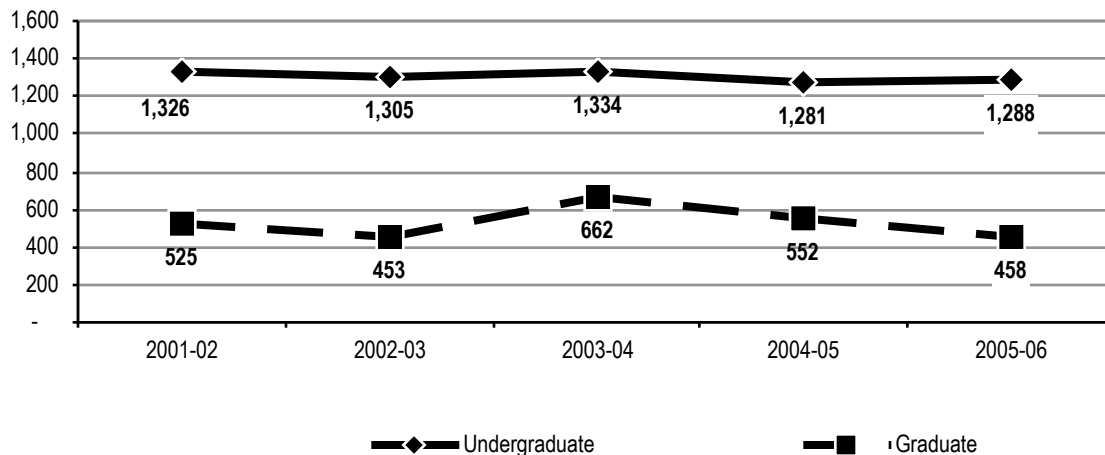
